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Important Information About Phase II Enhanced Vapor Recovery Requirements At Your Gasoline Dispensing Facility

The San Diego Air Pollution Control District (District) has revised the application submittal deadline for gasoline dispensing facilities (GDF) with annual gasoline throughput greater than 600,000 gallons. This deadline has been changed to allow GDF operators more time to evaluate Phase II Enhanced Vapor Recovery (EVR) systems currently certified and other systems which may be certified prior to the revised application submittal deadline. The State deadline for installing a Phase II (EVR) system has not changed and is still **April 1, 2009**. The District requires all GDF operators to submit an application for Authority to Construct (A/C) and Permit to Operate proposing a CARB certified Phase II EVR system by the following dates.

The following installation deadlines are applicable to GDF's subject to ISD requirements that are not required to install an ISD system by April 1, 2009. Please be advised that the District does not have an application submittal deadline for the installation of ISD. However, per District Rule 18, the District has up to six months to issue an A/C. **Therefore, applications for installation of an ISD system should be submitted six months prior to the following installation deadlines to ensure compliance.**

Annual Gasoline Throughput (gallons)	ARB & District Installation Deadline
> 1.8 million	September 1, 2009
600,000 to 1.8 million	September 1, 2010

APCD strongly encourages facilities to be proactive and to consider contractor and equipment availability and how it may impact meeting the required deadlines. Failing to comply with the requirements outlined in this advisory may result in enforcement action.
