Rule 1220 – Standards for Demolition and Renovation Operations – Asbestos Emissions Control	Adopt new rule to supplement and clarify federal asbestos removal regulations.
Repeal existing District Rules 361.140 – 361.156 and adopt by reference 40 CFR Part 61 Subpart M – National Emission Standards for Asbestos	Synchronize District rules with federal National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP).
