**NOTICE OF PRELIMINARY DECISION BY THE SAN DIEGO
COUNTY AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DISTRICT
TO ISSUE A SIGNIFICANT MODIFICATION OF
A FEDERAL TITLE V OPERATING PERMIT**

Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with Regulation XIV - Title V Operating Permits of the San Diego Air Pollution Control District's (District) Rules and Regulations, the Air Pollution Control Officer has made a preliminary decision to approve Application No. 983831 for a significant modification to federal Title V Operating Permit No. 978248 to incorporate revised source test conditions. The significant modification of the Title V Operating Permits allows for a 30-day period for completing required source testing after reactivating a unit not operated for an extended time period. Title V Operating Permit No. 978248 is issued to Larkspur Energy, LLC, for an electrical power generation facility located at 9355 Otay Mesa Road, San Diego, California.

The District performed an evaluation of the air pollution impacts of this proposal and the equipment is expected to operate in compliance with all applicable District Rules and Regulations. The modification will result in no hourly, daily or annual emissions increase of air pollutants from the facility.

The District is seeking comments on these proposed Title V Operating Permits. Written comments concerning the District's proposed action may be submitted for a period of 30 days commencing on September 7, 2007, and ending on October 8, 2007. Documents relating to the proposed action are available for public review at this address.

Members of the public may petition for a public hearing to provide comments on the proposed Title V Operating Permits. If the Air Pollution Control Officer determines that good cause exists, a public hearing will be scheduled.
