Amend Rule 69.4.1 – Stationary Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engines – Best Available Retrofit Technology (BARCT)	Revise to address BARCT for gas-fueled engines and consistency with ATCM and implement every feasible control measure.
Amend Rule 69.5 – Gas Water Heaters	Update, if warranted, to fulfill State requirement to adopt every feasible control measure.
Rule 1220 – Standards for Demolition and Renovation Operations – Asbestos Emissions Control	Adopt new rule to supplement and clarify federal asbestos removal regulations.
Repeal existing District Rules 361.140 – 361.156 and adopt by reference 40 CFR Part 61 Subpart M – National Emission Standards for Asbestos	Synchronize District rules with federal National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP).
