



Air Pollution Regulatory Agencies







California Air Districts

- California is divided into 35 independent air pollution control districts
- Each has similar authority & primary responsibility for regulating stationary sources of air pollution in its district

- Collected data will be used to develop strategies to reduce emissions & risk for residents




Community Emissions Reduction Plan

- Exploring air monitoring options at Tijuana River Valley




Border area monitoring locations

Ambient Air Quality Monitoring



APCD operates a network of ambient air monitoring stations located throughout the County to track regional ambient air quality trends



Note: Escondido site is currently under construction. San Ysidro site is only operational for measuring black carbon; it is currently being expanded to accommodate a full-service station that will also measure fine particulate matter & toxic air pollutants

Planning & Rule Development





- Prepare plans to achieve clean air throughout region
 - Ozone Attainment Plan
 - Portside Community Emission Reduction Plan

RULES

Rule Development

- Develop rules to implement those plans & reduce emissions from stationary sources
- Update rules as more effective control technologies become available
- Prepare rules as directed by the Board to protect public health

Compliance







Inspection Program

 Inspections of all regulated facilities to ensure compliance with air pollution rules & regulations

• In FY 2019-20, about 15,000 inspections were conducted



Program

Enforcement

- Takes enforcement action when it documents a violation
- Types of Enforcement **Documents:** Notices of Violation, Citations, and Notices to Comply
 - FY 19/20 -total of \$1.4M in penalties (~1,500 NOV and Citations)



- Complaint Investigations Responds to air quality **complaints**
 - Typical **complaints** include smoke,
 - dust, odors, improper
 - asbestos
 - removal.
 - unpermitted
 - equipment, & illegal burning
 - About 1,000 complaints were investigated in FY 2019-20



Assistance

Business

- Provides compliance assistance:
 - >Explanation of regulatory requirements
- > Courtesy *inspections*
- > Trainings
- >Participate in community outreach events
- In FY 19-20, the **District provided 19** compliance assistance trainings & 10 community outreach events

Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEPs)



Supplemental Environmental Projects can help build healthier communities by reducing air pollution, increasing environmental compliance, & raising public awareness to communities most burdened by environmental harm





Engineering



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- APCD evaluates about 400 applications annually.
- There are about 7,100 APCD permits in the San Diego region



Emission Inventory

- Quantifies emissions & determines significant sources of air pollutants
- Inventory reports are available to the public



- Air Toxic "Hot Spots" Program
- Evaluates toxic air emissions to determine which sources present public health concerns
- Requires facilities to notify communities & reduce their potential health risks

- CARB program audit was recently completed, CARB is currently issuing the report. Mandated completion by June 1, 2021




Statements
