

#### AMENDMENTS TO RULE 69.2.2 – MEDIUM BOILERS, PROCESS HEATERS AND STEAM GENERATORS

## **Rule 69.2.2 Medium Boilers**

- Adopted on July 8, 2020, and became effective on July 1, 2021
  - Controls and reduces air pollution that contribute to ozone oxides of nitrogen (NOx)
  - Specifies low NOx emission limits for <u>new</u> boilers
  - Requires registration and annual maintenance for new and existing boilers
  - Requires manufacturers to certify all new units

- Amendments are needed to:
  - Allow manufacturers to certify custom units after the units have been installed and tested.
  - Address EPA's recent comments identifying necessary rule updates needed for federal approval of the rule -
    - Language clarifications and updates to test methods section.

Current Requirements For Manufacturers	Proposed Requirements For Manufacturers of Custom Units
Certify all units 30 days prior to selling, offering for sale, or installing the unit -	Provide flexibility to manufacturers of custom units to certify after installation -
1. Test the units to confirm compliance with emission limits in rule; and	1. Perform required testing within 30 days after installation of custom unit; and
2. Submit all test data to District for verification.	2. Submit all test data to the District for verification, within 30 days after testing.

- Stakeholder Outreach
  - Notices provided to permit holders and stakeholders
  - Public workshop (July 2021)
  - Proposal posted on District website
- No issues were raised / no opposition to the proposal

- Recommendations
  - 1. Find that the proposal is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)
  - Adopt the Resolution in Attachment A entitled: Resolution Adopting Amendments to Rule 69.2.2 – Medium Boilers, Process Heaters, and Steam Generators
