Part 4—Certification

- I understand that the composite wood products must be used at a school that:
 - o Is located in a disadvantaged community, as described by <u>CARB's Priority Population Map</u>;
 - o Is under the exclusive control of the officers of the public schools; and
 - o Serves students in any grades from kindergarten through twelfth grade.
- I understand that the replacement composite wood products must be solicited and selected through a competitive bidding process, and the APCD must approve the selection. If glues are required to affix a wood veneer or synthetic material to the composite wood platform, the bids must specify NAF/ULEF glues, as certified by a CARB-approved third-party certifier. For each composite wood product type, I am including with this application two bids specifying NAF/ULEF glues and two bids that do not specify NAF/ULEF glues. The bids specify the composite wood material (hardwood plywood (HWPW), medium-density fiberboard (MDF), particleboard (PB), thin MDF) and the dimensions of the NAF/ULEF boards in the products.
- With this application, I am including photo documentation of the existing composite wood products including all manufacturer information, if on wood product.
- I understand that the replacement wood products must:
 - o have a similar use as old equipment,
 - o be a composite wood product, and
 - be certified by a CARB approved third-party certifier to ensure all materials used are NAF/ULEF.
