Background Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Program

Health Risk Assessment

• As per State law, NBSD was required to conduct a Health Risk Assessment based on their 2021 emissions

Approval

• State law requires the District and the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) to review and approve Health Risk Assessments conducted by facilities subject to the Hot Spots Program

Requirements

• Based on the approved Health Risk Assessment, NBSD exceeded the health risk threshold for Acute Health Hazard Index (Acute HHI), but did not exceed thresholds for chronic and cancer impacts. For this reason, NBSD was required to conduct public notification and will be required to submit a risk reduction plan for their 2021 emissions by July 1, 2025

Background Health Risk Assessments (HRA)

- A hot spots HRA is an assessment of potential health impacts that a person living or working near a source of air pollution may be exposed to
- Assessment is conducted according to a standardized procedure developed by a state agency (OEHHA)
- Based on estimates of emissions, modeled air dispersion, and health data






Elevated Health Risks NBSD's 2021 Emissions

Health Risk	2021 HRA Results	Risk Notification Thresholds	Risk Reduction Thresholds
Maximum Residential Cancer Risk	4.62 in one million	10 in one million	10 in one million
Maximum Worker Cancer Risk	3.48 in one million		
Chronic Non-Cancer Health Hazard Index	Resident – 0.00 Worker – 0.09	1	1
Acute Non-Cancer Health Hazard Index	Resident – 2.94 Worker – 7.13	1	1

Next Steps

NBSD is required to submit a Risk Reduction Audit and Plan (RRAP) based on their 2021 HRA by July 1, 2025

The Plan must demonstrate reduction of health risks below applicable thresholds of Rule 1210. Upon submittal to the District, the RRAP will be made available for public review and comment

NBSD will be required to provide progress reports on risk reduction annually until health risks are reduced below the thresholds




