Notice of Changes to Table II of Rule 1200 and Rule 1210

The Air Pollution Control District has revised Table II of Rule 1200 and Rule 1210. These tables list Toxic Air Contaminants with potential chronic non-cancer health impacts that must be evaluated under these rules.

Applicability Rule 1200 applies to new, relocated, or modified emission units which may increase emissions of one or more toxic air contaminant(s) and for which an Authority to Construct or Permit to Operate is required, or for which a Notice of Intention or Application for Certification has been accepted by the California Energy Commission.

Rule 1210 applies to each stationary source required to prepare a public health risk assessment pursuant to Section 44360 of the Health and Safety Code.

What has changed? Health values for Diethanolamine and Isophorone have been added, and health values for ten previously adopted compounds have been revised.

What do these changes mean? The new or modified health effects values will be used in calculating chronic non-cancer health risks in reviews of new, relocated, or modified sources emitting toxic air contaminants pursuant to Rule 1200. These new or modified health effects values will also be used in calculating chronic non-cancer health risks for the purpose of determining public notification and risk reduction requirements pursuant to Rule 1210. There are no changes to cancer potency values used for public health risk determinations under Rules 1200 and 1210.

Why are these changes necessary? Rules 1200 and 1210 require calculation of health effects to be based on health values adopted by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA). This change incorporates new and revised values adopted by OEHHA as of December 24, 2001.
