## Dear Community Member:

State law (Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Information and Assessment Act of 1987) ensures your right to know about possible health risks from toxic air contaminants emitted by sources of air pollution in your neighborhood. The San Diego County Air Pollution Control District (APCD) is the local government agency responsible for implementing this requirement in state law.

The following facility is required to notify all community members in the area where there is a potential health risk above thresholds established by the APCD.

Facility Name: Pacific Ship Repair and Fabrication, Inc.

Address: 1625 Rigel St, San Diego, CA 92113

Type of Business: Ship repair and fabrication facility

Based on air emission data in 2003, the APCD requested a health risk assessment from Pacific Ship Repair and Fabrication. The health risk assessment, approved by the APCD in 2008, shows that some toxic air contaminants, primarily nickel and hexavalent chromium, from Pacific Ship and Repair may be increasing the cancer risks for people who work in the area. Assuming the facility's emissions in 2003 persisted for 40 years, for people working closest to the facility, their chances of getting cancer could increase to 41 chances in one million. APCD Rule 1210 requires public notification when the cancer risk is above 10 in one million.

The APCD has prepared the enclosed "Program Fact Sheet" regarding its Air Toxic Hot Spots Program and a survey card to obtain your questions and comments regarding the information provided in this notice.
