The San Diego County Air Pollution Control District (District) will hold an informational public meeting to discuss its draft 2019 and 2020 Air Toxics “Hot Spots” Program Report, which is scheduled as follows:

The District’s annual report of its “Hot Spots” program is prepared in accordance with the State of California’s *Air Toxics “Hot Spots” Information and Assessment Act* (AB 2588, Connelly) enacted in 1987. This law requires facilities to quantify emissions of toxic air contaminants, conduct an assessment of health risk to the public based on the level of toxic emissions of concern, notify the affected public (if there is an elevated health risk), and reduce potential health risks to acceptable levels (if the health risk is significant). The District is the implementing agency of the “Hot Spots” program for San Diego County.

The District’s draft 2019 and 2020 Air Toxics “Hot Spots” Program Report summarizes the program’s elements, the status of the program in San Diego County, and emissions estimates, potential public health risks, emission reduction efforts, and status of public notifications and risk reduction plans for stationary sources subject to the program.
